Greetings Bethel,

Summer is a favorite time in our area for many people. Yet, I have noticed that although our schedules may change with the season, we may expect things to slow down a bit. For many the warmer weather has a way of letting the busyness creep up on us. More than once, I've heard (and expressed) the sentiment, "How did

it become August already?" Usually this is said with a sense that we didn't have the opportunity to relax more. There's also a real impulse to get even more things checked off the warm weather 'to do' list before Fall sets in.

You've heard it before, that we live in a fast-paced world, and faith remains counter cultural in how it invites us to slow down and experience life...not rush from one event to the next. The next time you are in worship, or an activity that brings you peace, I invite you to pay attention to the silences. You might be surprised that it is *there* that God may not only be speaking to you, but offering you restoration.

The Prophet Elijah would understand completely. There was a time when he was in crises. Speaking truth to power had drained him of energy to the point where he had deep doubts about his self-worth. Like many other prophets, his life was in danger, but he seemed beaten down and hopeless as he took a journey into the desert. Not only did God provide for him on the journey...

⁴ But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness and came and sat down under a solitary broom tree. He asked that he might die, "It is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors." ⁵ Then he lay down under the broom tree and fell asleep. Suddenly an angel touched him and





said to him, "Get up and eat." ⁶ He looked, and there at his head was a cake baked on hot stones and a jar of water. He ate and drank and lay down again. ⁷ The angel of the Lord came a second time, touched him, and said, "Get up and eat, or the journey will be too much for you." ⁸ He got up and ate and drank; then he went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God. ⁹ At that place he came to a cave and spent the night there.

Then the word of the Lord came to him, saying, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" ¹⁰ He answered, "I have been very zealous for the Lord, the God of hosts, for the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away." 1 Kings 19:4-10

...but God was also waiting for him in the silence with a word of hope and a new direction:

¹¹ He said, "Go out and stand on the mountain before the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by." Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind, and after the wind an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake, ¹² and after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire, and after the fire a sound of sheer silence. 13 When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. Then there came a voice to him that said, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" ¹⁴He answered, "I have been very zealous for the Lord, the God of hosts, for the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away." 15 Then the Lord said to him, "Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus; when you arrive, you shall anoint

Hazael as king over Aram. ¹⁶ Also you shall anoint Jehu son of Nimshi as king over Israel, and you shall anoint Elisha son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah as prophet in your place.

1 Kings 19:11-16

Elijah encounters God not in spectacular events of note, but in the sheer silence. Sheer silence. I like the sound of that a lot, and it might just be what many of us need in our lives. God didn't dismiss Elijah's pain and weariness, but through the ministry of presence, gave him a new mission- one of relationship. Elisha would not only become his successor, but a trusted friend and confidant. I wonder if Elijah would have noticed his need for Elisha if it wasn't for his openness to the sheer silence in which he encountered the same God who is calling out to us today.

I wish you blessings on your Summer! I hope to encounter God with you as we slow down to worship together, and the many blessings we find that will inform every other scheduled activity.
