Greetings,

I hope this newsletter finds you well! As a minister, I'm blessed to be welcomed into many sacred moments in times of sorrow and joy in people's lives. At times, we may feel alone in our grief, and yearn for 'the good times' when we feel supported in our accomplishments. Being part of a faith community allows for us to

know that we are surrounded by people who are going to be there for us in good times and bad. Truly, some of the most tender moments I've been a part of has been in times of absolute tragedy and grief. God's presence can be felt without a word being spoken, purely through the ministry of presence.

Emily Dickenson wrote in a time of great societal upheaval, in many ways not unlike today. Poetry has a timeless quality that can challenge, comfort, and transcend the moment for the listener. How would this poem be heard as the United States in the grip of the Civil War? (Although she wrote extensively, she wasn't published until 1890, four years after her death.)

Hope is the thing with feathers Emily Dickinson

Hope is the thing with feathers
That perches in the soul,
And sings the tune without the words,
And never stops at all,
And sweetest in the gale is heard;
And sore must be the storm
That could abash the little bird
That kept so many warm.
I've heard it in the chillest land,
And on the strangest sea;







Yet, never, in extremity, It asked a crumb of me.

This poem is in the public domain.

Perhaps this is why the liturgy and hymns are such a vital part of the worship experience. Although song is an art form unto itself, poetry is undeniably at work, as with Scripture as a whole. How do we have hope when those in power are using it with cruel intent, indifference, and seem to delight in the despair of those who care about the safety of others, even those we may never meet? This is a question I struggle with these days, as my understanding of the Christian faith is that we are called to see all people as beloved children of God. I give thanks for Scripture, not to reinforce my own biases, but as the source of inspiration from the Holy Spirit that grounds and sustains.

Read the poetic words of David in Psalm 62. David was quite a musician and wordsmith. Although he fell short and misused his earthly power as King, he also was wise when called to repentance, be it by prophet or his own conscience. Where do you hear God directing you through these words?

¹ For God alone my soul waits in silence; from him comes my salvation.

² He alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall never be shaken.

³ How long will you assail a person, will you batter your victim, all of you, as you would a leaning wall, a tottering fence?

⁴ Their only plan is to bring down a person of prominence. They take pleasure in falsehood;

⁸ Trust in him at all times, O people; pour out your heart before him; God is a refuge for us.

⁹ Those of low estate are but a breath; those of high estate are a delusion;

in the balances they go up;

they are together lighter than a breath.

¹⁰ Put no confidence in extortion, and set no vain hopes on robbery; if riches increase, do not set your heart on them.

Once God has spoken; twice have I heard this:

that power belongs to God, and steadfast love belongs to you, O Lord.

For you repay to all according to their work.

Every day is an opportunity to connect with God through the magnificent and mundane. And the best part-that we have so many opportunities to do so in a spirit of unity and hope.

A Successful MHS / ARC Blood Drive

Here's some information on the MHS blood drive held here on June 20th starting with collection results from that drive:



31 presenting donors; 2 first time donors; 3 deferrals; 22 whole blood units collected; 8 Power Red units collected = **30 total units collected**.

This drive is the last drive of the '24/'25 school year. For the total scholarship year, MHS collected 194 units, earning a \$2,800 scholarship. A new year starts with the August 20th drive (here at Bethel).
