Dear Bethel,

Last year we were blessed to hear many stories of generosity; from Bethel members, and ministry partners alike. Instead of focusing of nebulous 'what ifs?' motivated from a fear of scarcity, we had a dedicated group read the book "Ask, Thank, Tell" and be on the lookout for stories of generosity. Some were shared only

in the small group, others gave permission for them to be shared on Sunday morning and in this newsletter. What we found was that generosity takes many forms, it is all around us, and hearing how others are generous is intrinsically motivating. I'm certain that there's more stories out there, and invite you to reach out if you have one to share! In the meantime, try not to get hooked by the Christmas commercials that are already encouraging us that the best way to show our love is to buy <insert expensive product here>, and focus on Jesus' call:

Jesus looked up and saw rich people putting their gifts into the treasury; he also saw a poor widow put in two small copper coins. He said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all of them, for all of them have contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty has put in all she had to live on." -Luke 21:1-4

We live in a time when the ultra rich are using their great influence to divide us, and place the blame of society's ills upon the poor and vulnerable- that somehow ruthless (and heartless) business practices are to be lauded, while approaching those who suffer want are deserving of their fate. The same Jesus who overturned the tables in the Temple has much to say on this in his preaching, teaching, and call to generosity in daily living.





The world doesn't need billionaires, but God is calling for us to share the Christian message with all: to the rich- that there are some things that cannot be purchased, and there is great gain both now and in the world to come in generosity without an agenda. And to the poor- that the faithful are called to share not from a place of pity, but genuine love and concern. True wealth doesn't fit in a wallet or purse. It can only be found in the love of God that is freely shared with all of creation.

In the same way that Jesus was hidden from the eyes of the believers on their way to Emmaus, I believe the same is true today. Last year it was powerful to hear those stories of generosity, and the reason why some give so freely is because they recognize what God has always known: that when we give in love, we always get back more than we give.

#### ARC / Kiwanis Blood Drive



## Another Successful GWOH Project!

On September 7<sup>th</sup> a group of people from Bethel & Zion Lutheran Churches gathered at Zion to assemble sensory bags to be distributed to local first responders for this year's *God's work. Our hands. Project*.

We received a \$250 Grant from Thrivent Financial to purchase some supplies for this year's project and the remaining items were donated by people from both congregations. Because of your generosity we were able to assemble & distribute 35 bags containing fidget toys, sunglasses, noise-cancelling headphones, and small writing tablets. We also received and distributed 21 weighted blankets.

All of these items were distributed to both Marinette & Menominee City Police Departments & County Sheriff's Offices; Emergency Rescue Squad; Mid-County Rescue Squad; and Peshtigo City Police Department.

Our hope is that the items contained in these tool-kits will aid the first responders in our community to bring comfort to youth and neuro-diverse individuals during traumatic situations.

God's work. Our hands. Sunday is an opportunity to celebrate who we are as the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America — one church, freed in Christ to serve and love our neighbor.

Service activities offer an opportunity for us to explore one of our most basic convictions as Lutherans: that all of life in Jesus Christ – every act of service, in every daily calling, in every corner of life — flows freely from a living, daring confidence in God's grace.

Thank you to everyone who participated in this year's project. Whether you donated items or money, worked on *GWOH Sunday* and after, or brought food to feed the crew, we appreciate it all!
